Willard S. Plenti Sr. was born in Houston, Texas, and began pilot training in the

Army Air Corps in 1942. Mr. Pienti had a successful career as a military pilot that included serving during the Korean War and flying avariety of aircraft from trainers to bombers to flathers.

After his netinement from the Air Force at a Linux exact Conellin 1967, Mr. Pierett accepted a position with the Commonwealth of Virgina Austration Theory, Division of Aeronautics, Virgina State Corporation Commission, and in 1964 he became Director of Aeronautics. In 1970, he was a member of the Production Exchanging Commission, which helped shape America's current avision system. Mr. Pierett invincions the Virgina Department of Avision in 1968 and was elected to the Virgina's Austria reliable of Sent Historica year.

Mr. Plenti passed away May 19, 2005 leaving behind a devoted family and a record of outstanding service to avistios. In base of this remarkable gestleasus and his 22 years of service to the Commonwealth of Virginia, this scholambip program has been extend thed.
