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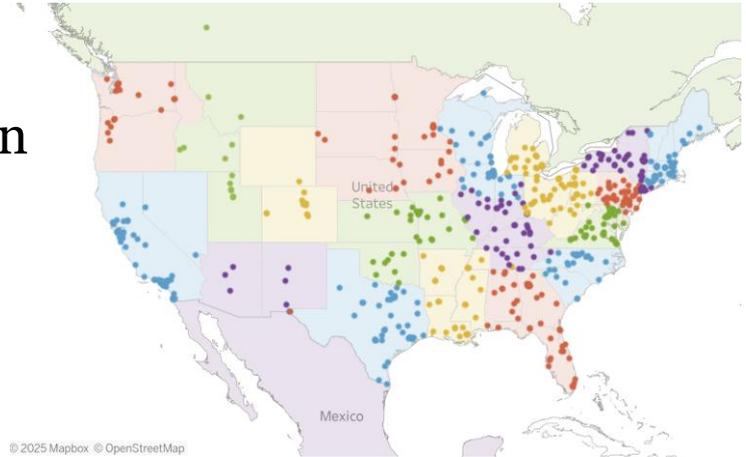
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Pion Project: the Role of Clubs

- Investigating the role of physics clubs for undergraduate women in physics.

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Our perspective & motivation

We are:

- First-time leaders
- Undergraduate women in physics
- Students with the same needs.

While studying physics identity in relation to clubs, we wondered:

1. How can a club truly be successful?
 2. What we can we do to help physics students be successful?
 3. How are student members affected?
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Methodology

Clubs = student organizations in which students interact with a physics community

- Identity based clubs
- STEM clubs
- physics clubs, etc

- 31 students interview data Pion
- 3 levels of coding:
 1. Clubs
 2. Experiences +ve
Experiences -ve
Expectations
- 1. Analytical grouping:
Leadership, Mentorship,
Community/Belonging,
Recognition

Club Experiences – how did these students experience physics/STEM clubs?

- Positive:
 - Community: Belonging + Recognition
 - Mentorship
 - Confidence and Development of Skills
- Negative:
 - No negative experiences for students who were actively participating in clubs

What do physics students want or need from physics/STEM clubs?

- **Mentorship:**
 - Places to network and find mentors
 - Connection to department
- **Recognition:**
 - Abilities recognized
 - Encouraged/pushed to pursue new roles/opportunities
 - Recognized as physics person

“a **grad student or faculty** member would come in, **talk about their experience and journey** with physics...We've also had events...about **plans for graduation and advice with what classes to take**”

Competence → Confidence

What do physics students want or need from physics/STEM clubs?

- **Leadership:**
 - Opportunities to expand skill-set
- **Community:**
 - Friendships/interpersonal bonds
 - Camaraderie
 - Sense of belonging

“I’m the president of Sigma Pi Sigma at my school....I really enjoy it. It’s taught me a lot.”

Competence → Confidence

How can clubs address student needs and expectations?

- Have networking and social activities
- Professional development activities
- Bringing faculty into club events so students can make connections for possible mentorship
- No-pressure space/events for students to exist in community
- Inviting and encouraging students to lead

What can departments do to meet student needs and expectations?

- Help promote clubs
- Engage in club activities
 - Present on research opportunities
 - Be open to mentor students
 - Get to know students through the clubs
 - Share personal experiences in physics
